ORDER

During the OAP status conference on May 8, 2008, Mr. Powers indicated that the PSC would be unable to comply with our April 16, 2008 order that directed the PSC to identify the third test case for Theory 2 prior to the start of the general causation hearing on May 12, 2008. Mr. Powers explained that PSC members had nominated five potential test cases, but, due to trial preparation for the general causation hearing, Dr. Mumper had yet to review the cases. He proposed identifying the third test case on or about June 13, 2008, two weeks after the conclusion of the Theory 2 hearing.

Recognizing the need for a third test case was occasioned by the late withdrawal of a case from the OAP, and, therefore, not the fault of the PSC, we nevertheless conclude that a further delay of more than five weeks to identify a third test case is unacceptable. Given the difficulty of coordinating the schedules of the parties, the special masters, and the expert witnesses, and the need for timely decisions in the test cases, it is of paramount importance that this process be completed expeditiously without further unnecessary delay. Accordingly, the PSC was ordered to designate the five potential test cases by name by no later than Friday, May 9, 2008. These names will not be disclosed publicly.

The PSC was also ordered to select the third test case by no later than Friday, May 23, 2008. While we recognize that this may require additional effort by Dr. Mumper during the Theory 2 hearing, it is a reasonable request as we are not requiring her to file an expert report by May 23, 2008. Once the case is identified, we will discuss with the parties a schedule for filing any additional expert reports.

The PSC is ordered to identify the five cases being considered for designation by FRIDAY, MAY 9, 2008, and to select the third Theory 2 test case by FRIDAY, MAY 23, 2008.
