## ORDER

## Restoring Procedures for Paper Filings

On November 2, 2020, the court issued an order modifying the procedures for paper filings due to conditions in Washington, D.C. that were anticipated to impact pedestrian and vehicular access to the National Courts Building. These conditions have resolved. Accordingly,

## IT IS ORDERED THAT:

- 1. The November 2, 2020, Order Modifying Procedures for Paper Filings is rescinded.
- 2. The Clerk's Office is directed to restore access to its night drop box on H Street, N.W.
- 3. As public access to the Clerk's Office remains restricted pursuant to the court's March 16, 2020, order, individuals, including pro se litigants and couriers, should continue to submit courtesy copies and case initiating documents either through the U.S. Postal Service or by deposit in the court's night box. Pro se litigants with active cases before the court shall, absent extraordinary circumstances, submit all filings e-mail case via ProSe case filings@cfc.uscourts.gov. See General Order No. 2 (Nov. 13, 2020) (available on the court's website at www.uscfc.uscourts.gov).
- 4. All deliveries from the U.S. Postal Service and third-party commercial carriers will be left in a designated area of the lobby. Any other deliveries must be coordinated ahead of time by appropriate court staff.

This order shall be circulated within the court, transmitted to the United States Court of Federal Claims Bar Association, and posted on the court's website.
